 - 7.2.3. Items added to the list are automatically grouped into sections

 - 7.3.1. Control-click a bubble
 - 7.3.2. Choose from recent emoji, or click the 😀 emoji icon to show the emoji keyboard

 - 8.1.1. Select some text
